

## Foreshore camping

### Flinders and Main beaches

Want the ultimate beach camping experience? Pitch your tent along the unspoiled shores of Flinders or Main beaches.

### Flinders Beach

With access from either Amity Point, Flinders Beach or Adder Rock at Point Lookout and only 19kms from Dunwich, unspoilt Flinders Beach offers some of the most magnificent foreshore camping.

### Features

- 4WD access only - permit required
- 200 shady campsites
- Environmentally friendly amenities
- Toilet facilities available
- Small cooking fire allowed - BYO firewood - Fire must be doused with water after cooking
- Ocean fishing
- Dogs permitted, conditions below

### Main Beach

Situated along the eastern coast, Main Beach has white sand surf beaches stretching over 20 kilometres along the Pacific Ocean.

### Features

- 4WD access only - permit required
- 300 unallocated camping sites
- Ocean fishing
- Natural surroundings
- Isolated location with no amenities
- Dogs permitted, conditions below

### Further information

Please note that it is advisable to check your tide times and 4WD permit conditions when travelling to either Flinders or Main beaches.

At Flinders and Main beaches, dogs must be kept on a leash at the campsite and on the beach. There is an off-leash area on the beach between Flinders access and Amity access.

## Make the most of your stay

### Water sports and fishing

There are a host of water based activities available, from surf fishing, to scuba diving, surfing and kayaking. Challenge your flair for fishing at the Amity Point rock wall and jetty, or indulge in surf fishing on Flinders and Main beaches.

### Whale watching and marine life

Whales can be seen from the stunning headlands (June to November), as well as dolphins, turtles, manta rays and more. If you're going for a stroll along the spectacular North Gorge walk, be sure to take your camera and binoculars.

### 4WD adventures

There are a number of enthusiastic 4WD tour operators on the Island to take you on an exploratory adventure to the lakes, beaches and headlands, providing facts along the way. For those wishing to take their own 4WD along Flinders and Main beaches, a yearly 4WD beach access permit is required. Be aware that regulations forbid 4WDs to move along the beaches around high tide (an hour before, and an hour after tide peaks).

### Historical hotspots

The North Stradbroke Island Heritage Trail is a self guided trail booklet exploring the deep-rooted history of the Island's past. Trail guides and further information can be obtained from the North Stradbroke Island Historical Museum, Visitor Information Centres and Council Customer Service Centres or contact 1300 667 386.

### Natural lakes

Some of the world's most ecologically important wetlands are located on Stradbroke Island. Brown Lake and the Keyholes are accessible by 4WD and walking trails, whilst Blue Lake is only accessible by foot.

### Dining

Enjoy a great range of dining alternatives from fish and chips overlooking the ocean and ice cream at Point Lookout, to a range of a-la-carte and café restaurant options.

## How to get there

North Stradbroke Island is easily accessible by water taxi or vehicle transportation barge. Both services depart from Cleveland and dock at the Island town of Dunwich. Please note that bookings for the barge are essential.
